

Available in a number of mellow tones. with variable textures and a gently undulating single or double camber, our tiles are produced using traditional methods, with or without nibs and in both standard and non-standard sizes.

Nibs or Peg Holes

Peg tiles were originally named after the softwood pegs that attached them to the laths or battens. Tudor roof tiles are available with peg holes (square or round) or with clay nibs on the underside, making them suitable for both ancient and modern building methods.



Recommended by Conservationists



Tudor 's characterful sand-faced plain and peg tiles have an instant aged and weather-worn appearance, tone and texture that is recognized by conservationists looking for 'like for like' handmade replacements.

Kent peg tiles go back as far back as the 12th and 13th centuries, when every town and village had its own kiln and tile-maker. The variation of colour, texture and the unevenness of these regional tiles were largely determined by the mix of the clay and aggregates, and the temperature and length of time in the kiln.

Tudor Roof Tiles continues to use these age-old, traditional handmade skills and craftsmanship, combined with modern firing techniques in order to produce characterful sand-faced tiles that not only have a unique individuality and distinctiveness, but also meet today's performance standards.

All our tiles are guaranteed and CE (UKCA) marked.



Bespoke Sizes

When restoring a historic church roof, it is important to pay attention not only to the tone, texture and camber of the original roof tiles, but also their actual size.

It is a fact that even the slightest change from the original roof tile size can damage the overall aesthetics and character of the roof.



Regular sizes are very much a modern phenomenon. Although modern roof tiles are generally 10" x 6" (255mm x 152mm), the Royal Charter of 1477 decreed that peg tiles should be 10½" x 6¼". However the reality is that the size of the peg and plain tiles that we see on old church buildings has always varied across the country.

For this reason, Tudor offers a wide range of bespoke and non-standard sizes that will help you to replicate and preserve the uniqueness of your roof.

Key points when choosing your roof tiles

- Choose Genuine Handmade Tiles - their aesthetic is ideally suited to period buildings and cannot be replicated by cheaper, more uniform machine made tiles.
- Compliment the Built Environment - always repect the size, texture and colouring of your existing roof tiles and those of the surrounding structures.
- Consult Local Planning
 Officers specific restrictions can
 often apply, particularly in conservation
 areas.
- Keep Character and Add Value

 choose tiles that enhance your
 building and which you will appreciate
 for years to come.
- Ensure Tile Durability and Quatlity - use roof tiles that conform to the latest BS EN 1304 Standards and are CE marked.
- Guaranteed be certain that your roof tiles are covered against failures by a guarantee of at least 25 years.
